Global Mission Update

—Kumamoto, Japan, Jackie and Patrick Bencke, Missionaries

A newsletter update from the Benckes arrived just before the end of May. Jackie wrote, "Vaccinations for the public are just getting underway with people age 80 and older now eligible to make appointments and receive the injection. Japan is very far behind the rest of the world in immunizing her people. Unfortunately, the variants have also hit various places in Japan, including Kumamoto, so the infection rates continue to climb. This concerns our family deeply, as Patrick is one of those with a condition that would mean complications are likely in the event of a COVID infection. Our college has been in remote learning since the end of April."

Both serve at Kyushu Lutheran College. Patrick is a teacher of English, and Jackie is the Director of Sacred Music. Please keep the Bencke family in your prayers especially during these challenging times in Japan.



Notice to all Gardeners

Do you ever find yourself with an excess of vegetables from your garden? Your freezer is full, you have run out of canning jars, and your neighbors lock their door when they see you coming with a box of greens? Instead of tossing these fresh usable vegetables into the compost pile, please consider bringing them to Trinity's Food Pantry for distribution to those that are in need of fresh healthy food choices.



Drop off your produce at Door 5 on Monday, Tuesday, or Thursday mornings throughout the growing season. Our guests thank you!

Trinity Food Pantry distributes over 15,000 pounds of food per month, serving over 400 families.

Protocols/Policies for Sunday Mornings

- By attending in person worship, you are agreeing to abide by Trinity's Safety Protocols.
- Only Door 3 will be available for entry into the building.
- Door 3 will open for registering family units 20 minutes prior to each worship service.
- Hands will be sanitized upon entry.
- Masks must be worn over the nose and mouth.
- Physical distancing of 6 feet will be maintained outside of household units.
- Ushers will seat family units together with six feet between families.
- There will be no congregant contact.
- Communion will be celebrated in non-contact ways.
- Ushers will release congregants by pew, and people will immediately exit through Door 2 or Door 3 after the worship service as directed by an usher.
- No congregant food or beverage activity will be permitted.
- The nursery, Rainbow Bags, children's books, and the library will not be available.



As I sit in my office at Trinity this morning writing this newsletter, I am listening to laughter and an animated conversation going on outside my door. These are sounds I have not heard since last March when Covid-19 began and we all started working from home. I cannot express the joy and happiness I feel to again be working with my friends.

And thus the inspiration for this month's newsletter: The importance and benefits of friendship. There are two scriptures from the Bible on friendship that call to me. Proverbs 17:17 *A friend loves at all times, and kinsfolk are born to share adversity.* The other one is John 15:15 (this is Jesus speaking to his disciples) *I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father.* Can you imagine how treasured the disciples must have felt to be called Jesus' friend?

- Encourage you to change or avoid unhealthy lifestyle habits such as excessive drinking or lack of exercise.


Friends also play a significant role in promoting your overall health. Adults with strong social support have a reduced risk of many significant




