The Liturgical Dance Teams will not meet this fall. The plan is to resume liturgical dance in the spring.



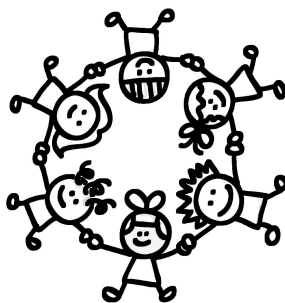

### Greetings from Noah's Ark Preschool and the ECE Program!

As I write this message, we are approaching the start of the school year for Noah's Ark, Come and Play, and Music and Movement. I must admit that I did not anticipate being in virtually the same spot this year with regard to COVID as we were last year! In addition, we have children coming into our program that may have had very different life experiences than are typical for children in their first three years of life! However, I continue to focus on the science and the recommendations of public health officials as we determine our COVID protocols. We will begin the school year with virtually the same protocols as last year including teachers and children, ages 3 and over, wearing masks while inside. It is the best proven way to keep kids safe! We hope to be able to loosen some protocols as the year progresses. In terms of the children coming into our space, perhaps with no experience being away from caregivers in the past year, I see our call to be the same as every year. We will love as Jesus commanded. We will ask God to let God's love flow through us in every interaction we have with each child. We will work together in caring for, guiding, and cherishing these children as the precious gifts from God that they are. We will work together to become God's peacemakers.



Noah's Ark classes will begin on Tuesday, September 7, with parent/child visits. The Early Childhood Enrichment classes will begin the week of September 14. We ask you to join with us in prayers for a fun, enriching, and safe year of early childhood programming.

## Nursery Care

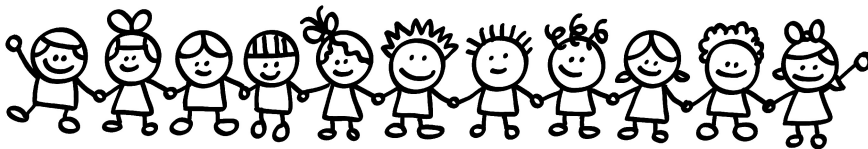

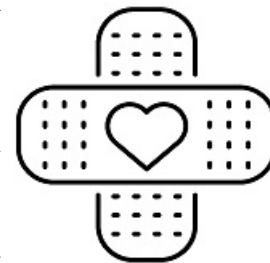

## Health Ministry

I always think of September as a busy time . . . back to school, vacations are over, and back to "IRL." If you already know what that stands for, you are both more text savvy and younger than I. I recently



learned that IRL stands for "in real life" from my 13 year old grandson. He tried to convince me that being in his bedroom playing computer games online with his friends was better than IRL. This was an opportunity for a grandparent teaching moment. We discussed how being in school, interacting face-to-face with his friends, being with people (in other words, "in real life") was so much better. He agreed with me after his first day back to IRL school.

September 12 is National Grandparents Day. Studies show that grandparents play an important part in their grandchildren's lives. We are much more than cookie bakers, treat givers, break a few rules and don't tell Mom and Dad people. Grandparents contribute to a child's well-being. Grandparents often have more time to support grandchildren in their activities; they can talk to their grandchildren about problems the child may be experiencing and help find solutions. Grandparents are like chicken soup for their soul. When kids are feeling ill or sad, grandparents often have just the right capacity to make them feel better. They often have both the patience and time to really comfort their grandchild. Studies show that grandparents who have strong relationships with their adult grandchildren make a difference in reducing depression for both grandparent and grandchild. Grandparents also give children a different perspective on life and are a connection to the past. They are "living history." What if you don't have a grandparent? There are many older adults (neighbors, friends, family members, church members) who would love to play a grandparent role for your child.

## Back to School

Everyone is weary of hearing about COVID guidelines and the CDC, but the CDC recently put the guidelines in terms of "layers of protection." Living in Wisconsin, as we do, brought thoughts of the layers we wear during winter to protect us from the cold. So here are the layers:

- Our Outside Heavy Duty Winter Coat: Vaccination is the leading public health prevention strategy to end the COVID-19 pandemic. So for ages 12 and over, get the vaccine.
- Our Sweater, Hoodie, or Sweatshirt Layer: Universal indoor masking by all students (age 2 and older), staff, teachers, and visitors to K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status.
- Our Thermal Underwear Layer: Physical distancing of 3-6 feet, depending on available space in the classroom.
- Hat, Gloves, Scarf Layer: Screening testing, ventilation, handwashing and respiratory etiquette, staying home when sick and getting tested, contact tracing in combination with quarantine and isolation, and cleaning and disinfection are also important layers of prevention to keep schools safe.

Many schools serve children under the age of 12 who are not eligible for vaccination at this time. Therefore, this guidance emphasizes implementing layered prevention strategies (e.g., using multiple prevention strategies together consistently) to protect students, teachers, staff, visitors, and other members of their households and support in-person learning. Please keep all teachers, staff, and children in your prayers for a safe and healthy school year.

## Red Cross Blood Drive

We collected 41 units of blood during our August Blood Drive. Thank you to everyone who donated and to Ardelle, Denise, Mike, and Ginny for helping with checking in donors. Your assistance made the day less stressful. There will be two Fall blood drives. The first is Friday, October 29, from 3:00 P.M.-7:00 P.M. This drive is organized by Keane Thompson, Trinity member, who is working toward getting his Eagle Scout. Then in November, we will have our last drive of 2021 on Thursday, November 18, from 12:30 P.M.-6:30 P.M. Please mark your calendars and sign up for one of these blood drives.

## What Does the Friends of Flynn Committee Do?

In October of 2010, a group of Trinity members met with Kim Hill Phelps, then principal of Flynn Elementary School and Trinity member, to begin discussion of developing a community partnership with Flynn School. The first formal committee of eight members met with Kim in November to name the program Friends of Flynn and set goals to help address the needs of Flynn student. Through an annual fund raiser in the spring, a grant from Trinity's Endowment Trust, and generous donations throughout the year, we strive for an annual budget of \$6,500 which supports our mutual goals.

- Weekend Meals • Most funds go toward providing weekend meals through the Feed My People Weekend Meal Project. Confirmation students pack the meals several times during the school year, and volunteers deliver the bags each week to the school.
- Healthy Snacks • Volunteers purchase, pack, and deliver healthy snacks twice a week in September and during testing time in the spring.
- Books • A new book is sent home with each child at the start of the Christmas break and at the end of the school year.
- Emergency Clothing and Shoes • Several sizes of new pants, shirts, underwear, gym shoes, and boots are made available for Flynn staff to distribute to students as needed.
- Staff Appreciation • We recognize the Flynn staff several times each school year by providing special treats and a "demonstration" of support by marching around the outside of the building carrying signs of encouragement.
- School Supplies • We ask Trinity members congregation to purchase school supplies during the summer to assist families at the beginning of the school year.
