Call and Hiring Update

The Call Process for the Pastor of Care and Concern is moving forward with three candidates. Interviews have begun and will proceed until April 18. At that time, the Call Committee will review all three candidates and: choose one to put forward to the Council, ask candidates for more information or another interview, or turn down all three candidates and begin again. The Call Committee is committed to selecting the right candidate for Trinity.

The Coordinator of Community Connections position has been adjusted and is advertised internally and externally on a variety of media platforms. The committee met recently and discussed the job description. They decided to make the position one-half time and seek an individual who can devote all their time to the interaction and relationship building necessary for successful ministry. I endorse this plan and have shared the plan with staff, the Executive Committee, and the Church Council. They endorse the decision as well. The technological support necessary to better connect our congregation and community will be accomplished by contracting with a local firm, Stokes & Herzog (www.stokeshertzog.com). The principals of the company, Chris Herzog and Sarah Stokes, are Trinity members. You will know their work from a recent video creation for the Noah's Ark preschool and last year's Lent video series. Their expertise and experience will help Trinity in areas such as video creation, social media content, and research into the interests and expectations of people seeking a church. That relationship formally begins on April 1. As candidates come forward for the Coordinator position, we will determine their qualifications, invite them for an interview if the committee wishes, and hire the best candidate.

In each position, we continue to work within the same budget since the beginning of this process, based on previous personnel expenses. Celebrate Children's Book Week





HEALTH MINISTRIES

Dear Trinity Community,

As I begin this newsletter, I am feeling stressed and rushed with too many things on my "to do" list. It's not December; it's not the end of the school year. There is no reason I should be feeling this way. But I am! And, it is of my own making. So as I looked for inspiration this month, I found the following in one of my e-mails from Church Health Publication. The title is "Building Stamina in a Busy Season." (Aren't they all???)



1. **Eat for energy:** It is tempting to grab whatever is available, which usually are sweet, salty, and of little nutritional value. These foods can actually drain our energy. Even fast food chains now have healthier options available. Think fruits, vegetables, lean protein, whole grains (complex carbs). Complex carbohydrates give you an energy boost, and protein gives you staying power. It can be as simple as a piece of peanut butter toast and an apple. And, do NOT skip breakfast. Even a container of yogurt can jump start your day.
2. **Keep moving:** Busy schedules play havoc with exercise routines. But movement increases energy and stamina. So work it into everyday moments; park at the far end of the parking lot, take the stairs, pace while waiting, stretch while working. Remember, something is better than nothing!
3. **Fight fatigue:** Stressful periods can cause insomnia which can destroy stamina. Try to stay on your usual sleep schedule. Turn off the electronics an hour before you go to bed. Take five minutes to meditate.
4. **Stay positive:** It is easy to lose sight of our blessings and the goodness in our lives when our lives are demanding. To keep perspective, remember to take a moment to reflect on the things for when you are grateful. Remember God is walking right beside. You are not making this journey alone.

National Healthcare Decisions Day



Last year we had a young woman in her 30s who become gravely ill, was in Critical Care for several weeks, and then died. Her family had to request the court for guardianship so they could make healthcare decisions for her. Not only is this difficult for family, but it is time consuming and costs \$3,000–5,000. So I ask everyone reading this, complete an Advance Directive. We have them at church, and doctors' offices and hospitals also have them. They are truly a gift to your family.
