When You Desire Baptism



Women & Justice



Dear Friends in Christ,

"Mom, they used to say that only boys could fly airplanes but that's not true," our oldest daughter, Meta, said to me at bedtime the other night. "And anyway, girls are better than boys!" she added. While I affirmed her line of thinking on the first statement, I corrected her on the second. Girls and boys are equal, I let her know, and added some unsolicited commentary on how boys can wear pink and girls can be soldiers, etc.

My six year old's comment wasn't entirely without prompting. For the last few months, we have been reading a book together called "Good Night Stories for Rebel Girls" which uplifts the narratives of amazing women—from Amelia Earhart and Jane Goodall to Frida Kahlo and Queen Elizabeth—and does so in a way that young people can connect with and understand. While we do enjoy many other books, it's refreshing to offer my impressionable daughter images of women that go beyond a Disney princess or Barbie.

Perhaps you have never treated your sons or daughters differently. Perhaps you have not felt the barrier or been encountered differently based on whether you were male or female. Perhaps it is a wonder to you why this is even a conversation in 2018 at all! Yet study after study shows that there remains both an opportunity and pay gap between men and women in this country. Ordained ministry remains closed to women in many Christian denominations. And a study cited by NPR found that 81 percent of women had experienced some form of sexual harassment during their lifetime.

In Genesis 1:27, the litany of the creation ends with the statement: "So God created humankind in God's image, in the image of God they were created, male and female, God created them." There is a fundamental affirmation in our faith that God created all people equal, and God intends for all people to flourish and have life abundantly.

Recognizing this aspirational value, and the lived experience of so many women, the ELCA is in the process of drafting a social statement on Women and Justice. The draft that is in circulation, based on a study by a task force released in August of 2016, represents an initial attempt to formulate a social statement. It is intended to encourage deliberation on what this church should say about issues of sexism and patriarchy.

That's where we come in. ELCA congregations are invited to study and offer comments on the draft document, which will then be voted on this coming fall at the ELCA's church-wide assembly. On May 9 and 16 at 6:30 P.M. you are invited to a two-part conversation surrounding this draft statement on Women and Justice. The statement can be found online at <http://elca.org/womenandjustice> and print copies are available at our information center.

I look forward to faithful conversation and civil discourse surrounding a topic that affects us all. If you have any questions about the social statement or the upcoming forum events, any of the Trinity pastors will be happy to sit down with you!







Getting the Most Out of Your Doctor's Visit

This week, I had my monthly clinic nurse meeting. The main topic of discussion was the patient appointment and how frustrating it can be for staff when a patient's needs do not fit with the allotted time. Scheduling an appointment may seem simple enough, but there are several parts to the process. These include the patient arrival time, the nurse rooming time, the "provider enters the exam room" time, the patient's 20 or 40 minutes with the provider (determined by number of medications or concerns of the patient, complexity of the problem sore throat is usually quick; abdominal pain is complicated), and wrap up time. Here are some tips on how to get the MOST out of your provider visit:

- When you call for an appointment and you have multiple concerns or questions, ask for a long appointment (usually 40 minutes).
- Prepare for your appointment before arriving: What do you want from the visit? What is your top priority? What questions do you have? If it is a 20 minute appointment, you will only be able to address a couple of concerns. Write these things down.
- Speak Up: Providers are trained to evaluate symptoms and determine what is causing them. They are not mind readers nor do they have a crystal ball. Make a list of your symptoms, when they occur, what they feel like. Even if something seems minor or unrelated, share it.
- Be Honest: Don't hide embarrassing symptoms. Trust me.....we have heard it all before! Don't diminish side effects of medications that are making you uncomfortable.
- Listen reflectively: Ask for clarification if you do not understand! Understanding your treatment plan, even a medication choice, helps you



fully participate in your care and healing.

- Double Check: Before leaving the appointment, check your notes to make sure everything important to you was covered. Make sure you understand and are clear on your instructions and follow-up.

It is fine to bring a relative or friend with you to the appointment. Having a second person to listen and take notes is always a good thing.


