Come and worship on Sundays this month (times remain at 8:15 A.M. and 9:45 A.M.). The season of Easter ends this Sunday. Then, on June 12, the church worldwide celebrates "Pentecost."

Without commercial or societal fanfare, this third major festival of the Christian Church marks the coming of the third-person of the Trinity: the Holy Spirit. Unlike Christmas and Easter that have captured attention to become major global holidays, Pentecost announces the Holy Spirit that is found in "sighs too deep for words." The Spirit of God moves through creation, giving us life, energy, imagination, and courage to face the challenges of today. Jesus breathed on his disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit." With every breath, we can receive that same life-giving power that breaks down barriers of ethnicity, gender, sexual identity, age, and faith tradition. With every breath, we can experience Spirit, enabling us to receive and give the divine inspiration that transforms all things; mind, body, spirit, relationships, and the planet. Breathe deeply God's Spirit; be transformed and inspired.

Come, Holy Spirit!

During the month of June we will celebrate the day of Pentecost and Holy Trinity Sunday. Both of these occasions give opportunity for us to ponder the gifts of the Holy Spirit among us. How does the Holy Spirit work in us and through us? Where do we see the Holy Spirit at work in our world? These are profound questions of faith, sometimes answered through our experiences, sometime left to the manifold mysteries of God. But I offer you something to "breathe in," if you will.



The Holy Spirit conspires in us; yes, it's true! The word "conspire," from its Latin origins, means to "breathe together." It means to be filled with the same spirit, enlivened by the same breath. The word "conspire" probably doesn't come to mind when you think of the Holy Spirit, faith, or church. But I think it fits as we think about what the Holy Spirit is up to in us, among us, and through us.

The Holy Spirit does "conspire" when we breathe together as a people of faith. The Holy Spirit swoops in and out among us and weaves us together through the songs we sing, the prayers we pray, the breaths we breathe. Like on that first Pentecost, the Holy Spirit blows and breathes in us...and amazing things happen here, just as they did long ago.

Barbara Brown Taylor, a wonderful and creative preacher, inspired me with the notion of the Holy Spirit as the breath of God "conspiring" with us. She also suggests that when Jesus breathed his last breath on the cross and gave up his spirit, his very breath became ours. God breathes on us the Holy Spirit, enabling us to do and be the hands and feet of Christ: to be grace, to breathe hope, to show mercy as hard as it often can be. The Holy Spirit enables us to do that which we cannot do on our own.

As you breathe in the warm air of summer, as you run and play, as you work and rest, as you pray, laugh and cry, consider how the Spirit of God is breathing in you. Consider how, in faith, God's Spirit breathes in us together, too. Maybe you will discover God's Spirit breathing with incredible force and clarity in your life; maybe you will discover God's Spirit breathing in more of a whisper: an idea, a prayer, a new dream. Either way, God's Spirit is breathing in your life. It's not a question. God's spirit is breathing, conspiring, in you. I encourage you to take notice. See what might happen when you seek to breath with God.

Memories from Mission Jamaica

Ashley Goetz was part of the Mission Jamaica Team as a high school student.

This is an excerpt of some of her thoughts on her trip:

Delivering food to families was fun, but it changed me. Not just seeing where the people live, but also their homes and the conditions they lived in was unbelievable. Most families had no money, so they built homes with what they could find. This included wood, wire, sheets of metal, blankets, and old furniture. Everyone that we gave food to was cautious. No one had ever given them food before. They would try to keep it safe so it would not be stolen. When they found out we were not from Jamaica, they thanked the Lord that he sent us to them. Their faces lit up when they talked to us. What an experience!

Going on this mission trip has made me appreciate everything that I have. It has shown me that I am lucky to have a home, furniture, food, clothing, and everything I do in my every day life. In my journey with God, I will take what I have done and seen with me and remember how all our lives were changed that week.

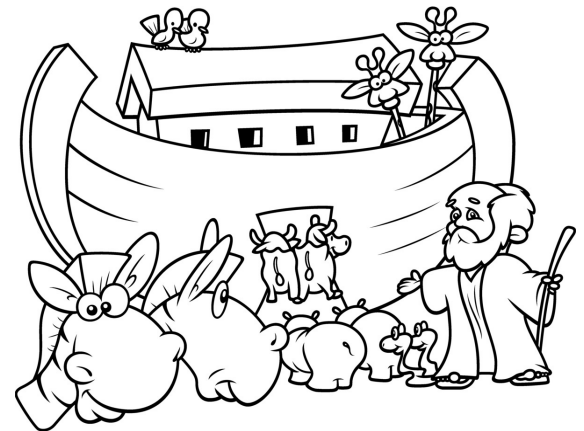

New to Our Library

Adult Fiction

- *In the Company of Others* by Jan Karon. This book is part of a Father Tim series and is set against the music of Irish song and storytelling. (FIC KAR)
- *Her Mothers Hope* by Francine Rivers. Spanning from the early 1900s to the 1950s, this novel is the first part (Marta's Legacy Part 1) of a saga about family and faith, dreams and disappointments, and the depths of grace and forgiveness. (FIC RIV)
- *House: The Only Way Out Is In* by Fran Peretti and Ted Dekker. These two Christian authors have joined forces for the first time to craft a supernatural thriller. (FIC PER)
- *Maid to Match* by Deeanne Gist. This snapshot of the lives of late-nineteenth-century servants is rich in detail, and readers will root for the characters as they face one difficult situation after another with courage and faith. (FIC GIS)
- *The Voyage of Promise* by Kay Marshall Strom. Straight from the nightmare of the eighteenth-century African slave trade comes the robust story of Grace Winslow, a woman with an African royal for a mother, an Englishman for a father, and an African husband recently taken captive in the slave trade. (FIC STR)
- *Fatal Convictions* by Randy Singer. In a novel whose religious themes are handled adroitly and subtly, Alexander Madison, a Virginia Beach attorney and part-time pastor, really cares about finding justice for those in desperate need of it. (FIC SIN)
- *The Bishop* by Steven James. The fourth Patrick Bowers thriller finds the FBI criminologist encountering his cleverest foe in a fresh and exciting story. (FIC JAM)
- *Blink of an Eye* by Ted Dekker. Miriam is a Saudi princess promised to another, Seth is a certified genius with a head full of numbers. Cultures collide when they find themselves thrown together as fugitives in a high-stakes chase across Southern California. (FIC DEK)
- *A Distant Melody* by Sarah Sundin. Book 1 in the Wings of Glory Series, A Distant Melody is an exciting and tender story of love, courage, and sacrifice during World War II. (FIC SUN)
- *I Shall Not Want: The Psalm 23 Mysteries* by Debbie Viguie. Presbyterian church secretary Cindy Preston and rabbi Jeremiah Silverman are trying to stay out of the way of a murder investigation. Their last amateur-sleuthing foray landed them in the sights of a serial killer. But when homeless people begin getting killed, keeping out of it is no longer an option. (FIC VIG)
