
Save the Date!

From Pastor Tom,

Summer is right around the corner with family vacations, busy activity schedules, lake time, and so much more. If you are like me, you are searching for any blank space on your calendar! Summer is a great time to try a new spiritual practice or get outside of your comfort zone and worship in new ways. Take a look at this list and try some or come up with your own!



- ★ **Devotions.** Many people begin their day with a short reading from a book of devotions or from an automated email. They are a simple way to ground yourself during your day in scripture and some food for thought. Often it takes no longer than five minutes, so why not try it out? At church we have two quarterly publications available, "Christ in our Home" and "Sundays and Seasons," but I might also suggest subscribing to "God Pause" from Luther Seminary via your email account.
- ★ **Worship at another congregation or at Praise in the Park.** Many of you will take family vacations outside of the area, so this is a perfect time to see how other congregations worship! If you are looking for other ELCA churches in a new town, check out the ELCA's website to locate other congregations. If you are staying in Eau Claire, worship with multiple ELCA congregations (including Trinity) down at Phoenix Park on Sundays at 10:00 A.M.
- ★ **Pray.** Seems pretty easy, doesn't it? Yet, I think many of us do not use this spiritual practice outside of asking for things or asking for help. Try and pray to God for things you are grateful for or things that make you happy. Still don't feel confident? Start by praying the Lord's Prayer every day and see how you grow in your ability to pray.
- ★ **Read the Bible.** Ok, I know what you may be thinking, "That's a lot of reading, and it can be quite boring!" Here is what I suggest: read and memorize a verse a day from the book of Psalms and see how that verse makes you more aware of God's activity in the world. I did this for two weeks once and was very surprised!

Trinity Book Club

The book club meets on Tuesday, May 17, at 5:30 P.M. at the home of Pat Mertens, 640 Foxmoor Lane, Eau Claire, to discuss *Five Days Gone* by Laura Cumming. In the fall of 1929, when Laura Cumming's mother was three years old, she was kidnapped from a beach on the Lincolnshire coast of England. There were no screams when she was taken, suggesting the culprit was someone familiar to her, and when she turned up again in a nearby village several days later, she was found in perfect health and happiness. No one was ever accused of a crime. The incident quickly faded from her memory, and her parents never discussed it. To the contrary, they deliberately hid it from her, and she did not learn of it for half a century.

- *Carnegie's Maid* by Marie Benedict. With captivating insight and heart, *Carnegie's Maid* tells the story of one brilliant woman who may have spurred Andre Carnegie's transformation from ruthless industrialist into the world's first true philanthropist. (FIC BEN)





Camp Come and Play
