

- *Horse* by Geraldine Brooks. Based on the remarkable true story of the record-breaking thoroughbred Lexington, *Horse* is a novel of art and science, love and obsession, and our unfinished reckoning with racism. (FIC BRO)
- *The Lioness* by Chris Bohjalian. A luxurious African safari turns deadly for a Hollywood starlet and her entourage in this riveting historical thriller. (FIC BOH)
- *Her Hidden Genius* by Marie Benedict. This new novel shines a light on a woman who sacrificed her life to discover the nature of our very DNA; a woman, Rosalind Franklin, whose world-changing contributions were hidden by the men around her but whose relentless drive advanced our understanding of humankind. - *When the Stars Go Dark* by Paula McLain. Weaving together actual cases of missing persons, trauma theory, and a hint of the metaphysical, this propulsive and deeply affecting novel tells a story of fate, necessary redemption, and what it takes, when the worst happens, to reclaim our lives and our faith in one another. - *Oh William!* by Elizabeth Strout. This Pulitzer Prize author explores the

mysteries of marriage and the secrets we keep, as a former couple reckons with where they have come from and what they left behind. (FIC STR)

- *The Woman with The Blue Star* by Pam Jenoff. Inspired by true stories during World War II, this novel is an emotional testament to the power of friendship and the extraordinary strength of the human will to survive. (FIC JEN)

- *Back to the Prairie* by Melissa Gilbert. Melissa Gilbert, star of *Little House on the Prairie*, returns with a new memoir, both hilarious and heartfelt, chronicling her journey from Hollywood to a ramshackle house in the Catskills during the COVID-19 pandemic. (B GIL)

*The Book of Lost Friends* by Lisa Wingate

I am a fan of historical fiction. I have read many books in our library about people who survived wars, especially World War II, as well as novels by Marie Benedict about extraordinary women who were the behind-the-scenes people in great events of history. These novels always make me look deeper to find out more about these people and events. *The Book of Lost Friends* is just that type of historical fiction. It is the story of three young women on a journey in search of family amidst the destruction of the post-Civil War South and of a modern-day teacher who rediscovers their story and its connection to her own students' lives. Lisa Wingate brings to life stories from actual "Lost Friends" ads that appeared in Southern newspapers after the Civil War as freed slaves searched for loved ones who were sold off.

## Trinity Food Pantry

If you ever drive down Clairemont Avenue on a Monday, Tuesday, or Thursday afternoon, you may notice a line of cars heading toward door 5. Yes, the Food Pantry is open and operating at full capacity, serving our guests in a safe and generous way four times per week.


We have served over 3,300 guests, distributing nearly 131,000 pounds of food so far this year. We could not have served these people without you!

With rising food costs (as we all are experiencing), food rescue is an important mission for our pantry. We currently have a dedicated group of volunteers pick up donations from Aldi, HyVee, and Kwik Trips in our community twice per week. This provides us with meats, fresh foods, and dairy products we would be unable to provide our guests without these pick ups. Please support and thank our Kwik Trip partners on Patton St, Brackett Ave, Golf Rd, Birch Street, River Prairie in Altoona, plus Aldi and HyVee. They have donated over 36,000 pounds of food so far this year! Thank you to all volunteer rescue food drivers.

Your continuing financial support, produce from your gardens, food donations, bags (paper and plastic), and volunteer time all contribute to our Food Pantry success in providing to those that are food insecure.

## Mental Health Crisis Support: Call 988

Beginning July 16, people in Wisconsin in mental health crisis have a new way to reach out for help. Simply call or text 988. This new program is designed similarly to the 911 emergency program. The 988 number will connect people who are suicidal or in any other mental health crisis to a trained mental health professional. NO busy signal; NO being put on hold. You will talk to a "real" person

right away.

Unlike other medical emergencies, mental health crises often result in a law enforcement response. The idea for 988 is to reduce interactions with law enforcement and connect people in mental health crisis to the help they need right away. The 988 lifeline will connect people to the existing network of more than 200 local crisis call centers around the country. People who call or text 988 will be connected to a trained counselor at a crisis center closest to them. If a local crisis center is too busy to respond right away, the call gets routed to one of 16 backup centers.

## UV Safety Awareness

To stay safe from too much sun exposure, seek shade, especially between the hours of 10:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. when the sun's glare is most intense. If you are going to be in the sun, the American Cancer Society recommends you "Slip, Slop, Slap, and Wrap."

- Slip on a shirt. Clothing with darker and more vivid colors will absorb more UV light than pale colors.
- Slop on broad-spectrum sunscreen with a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 15.
- Slap on a hat, preferably one that is wide-brimmed.
- Wrap by wearing wrap-around sunglasses to protect your eyes and the skin around them.

Other precautions include staying out of indoor tanning beds and performing skin self-exams to check for cancer.



## Baptism Class Coming Soon



## Life Finds A Way

Earlier this summer *Jurassic Park World Dominion* was released, making it the sixth movie in the series that began as a movie adaptation from Michael Crichton's work in 1993. Naturally, I have slowly been watching all of these movies again to relive childhood nostalgia and enjoy my kids' current love for all things dinosaurs. In the very first film, Dr. Ian Malcom (played by Jeff Goldblum) criticizes some of the safeguards of the Jurassic Park scientists when they bred only females by saying, "Life finds a way."

This time of the church year is called "ordinary time" or the "season after Pentecost." In our worship center we see the pulpit and altar decorated with green cloth. Pastor Patrick and I wear our green stoles when we fully vest at the 8:15 A.M. service. These visual cues in worship, as well as our readings of discipleship and teachings from Jesus, are all about the growth and development of faith in those first gathered as well as us today. It's as if during this ordinary time we recognize that God's gift of faith finds a way to grow within us. In other words, "life finds a way." How might you be growing and deepening your faith during this season? How might whatever seemingly small act be transformed by God into something awe inspiring and grace filled? How does God's abundant life find a way in you?
