Slovakian Sauerkraut Soup Recipe: Serve 18-20

- 2 lbs kielbasa sausage cut into ¼ - ½ inch slices. Browned in frying pan.
- 1 pkg (bag, not canned) sauerkraut, drained.
- 4-5 carrots sliced in ½ pieces
- 4 celery stalks chopped
- 1 medium onion chopped and sauteed in same frying pan as kielbasa
- 8 oz mushrooms sliced and sauteed in same frying pan as kielbasa
- Garlic minced: to taste
- Black pepper to taste
- 1 quart water, 1 quart beef broth
- Put all the above in a large pot, bring to a boil, then simmer on low for 3 hours.
- Add more beef broth if needed and 1 Tbsp of white sugar
- Another kind of meat could be used instead of the kielbasa. The amount of veggies can be adjust for a smaller or bigger group.

Book Club Guest

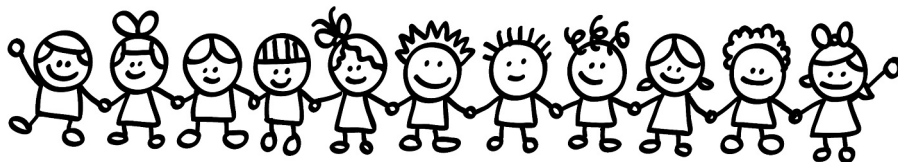

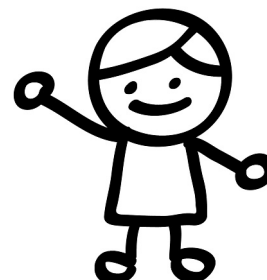
Rally Sunday September 11

Normal Pressure Hydrocephalus We have an advocate at Trinity!

A few years ago Dorothy Sorlie, a member of Trinity, was diagnosed with Normal Pressure Hydrocephalus (NPH). Prior to her diagnosis and treatment, she was wheelchair/walker confined, had urinary incontinent, and mild dementia. It took nearly three years for doctors to find what was causing Dorothy's symptoms. Today, she is fine—and is living a full life again. Governor Evers, at Dorothy's request, has proclaimed September as Hydrocephalus Awareness Month and September 15 as Hydrocephalus Awareness Day.

Normal Pressure Hydrocephalus (NPH) a condition, often undiagnosed or misdiagnosed as Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, or just old age, is too often missed by the medical community. The Hydrocephalus Association estimates that less than 20% receive an accurate diagnosis. www.hydroassoc.org

Normal Pressure Hydrocephalus occurs if the normal flow of Cerebral Spinal Fluid throughout the brain and spinal cord is blocked in some way. This causes the ventricles to enlarge, putting pressure on the brain and the symptoms arrive: unsteady gait, urinary incontinence, and dementia. It's important to be aware of the symptoms which too often are mis-diagnosed as Parkinson's, Alzheimer's or just old age. If you observe the symptoms in a friend, a relative, a neighbor or yourself, address it; at least verify that NPH is not present. Many physicians dismiss NPH—completely. Sometimes you need to PUSH! Back to School

Covid safety guidelines in terms of "layers of protection." Living in Wisconsin as we do, I immediately thought of the layers we wear during winter to protect us from the cold. Covid continues to live among us.

- Our outside heavy duty winter coat: Vaccination... is the leading public health prevention strategy to end the COVID-19 pandemic. So get vaccinated or boosted.
- Our sweater, hoodie, or sweatshirt layer: Masking is no longer mandated, but if you are not feeling well or you have a person in your class who is immunocompromised or has a chronic health concern, wearing a mask is the right thing to do.
- Our thermal underwear layer: Physical distancing of 3-6 feet, depending on available space in the classroom.
- Hat, gloves, scarf layer: When physical distancing cannot be followed. Screening testing, ventilation, handwashing and respiratory etiquette, staying home when sick and getting tested, and cleaning and disinfection are also important layers of prevention to keep schools safe.

Prayer for Teachers

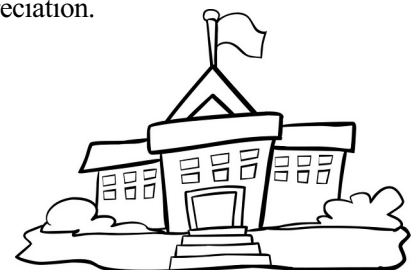

What Does the Friends of Flynn Committee Do? In October of 2010, a group of Trinity members began discussion on developing a community partnership with Flynn School. The first formal committee of eight members met with the principal, Kim Hill-Phelps in November to name the program Friends of Flynn and set goals to address the needs of Flynn students. The work of the committee started then and remains active in meeting the needs of Flynn students today. Through an annual fund raiser in the spring, a grant from Trinity's Endowment Trust, and generous donations throughout the year, we strive for an annual budget of \$6,500 which supports our mutual goals. Goals include providing Weekend Meals, healthy snacks, free books twice a year, emergency clothing and shoes, and staff appreciation.
