Trinity Lutheran Inclement Weather Policy

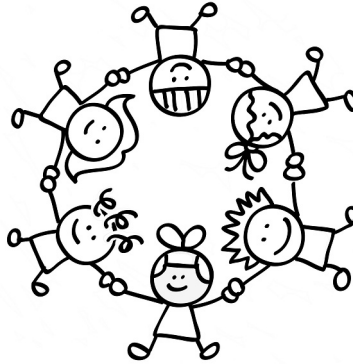

The Trinity Book Club invites you to join them on Tuesday, January 17, in the Room 208 at 6:30 P.M. to discuss *Black Cake* by Charmaine Wilkerson. Sign-up at Clipboard Central if you plan to attend.

In present-day California, Eleanor Bennett's death leaves behind a puzzling inheritance for her two children, Byron and Benny: a black cake, made from a family recipe with a long history, and a voice recording. 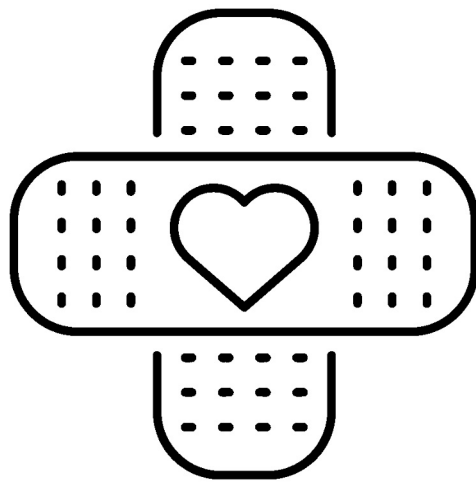
From the Parish Nurse

During Advent, Mary Beth Patterson and I led a Bible study on three Wise Women: Hannah, Elizabeth, and Mary. At our first meeting, we discussed women in our personal lives who we considered wise and had a positive impact on us. For many of us, it was our mothers, grandmothers, friends, or teachers. As we continued to meet each Saturday, I felt a strong conviction that those of us sitting in that circle were also wise women. We are positively impacting family members, friends, and co-workers. We have all been given special gifts/talents and faith that bring wisdom to others whose lives we touch. We need to let our wisdom shine into our world. In 2023 I challenge you to use your gifts and wisdom and let your light shine on everyone in your life.

...the wisdom from above is first pure, the peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace. James 3:17–18

I also have to share one more personal thing. Today is December 15, and last night we received several inches of snow.... the "making a good snowman" kind of snow. My drive today into town on Lowes Creek Road was one of beauty and awe. The trees were laden with snow, and picture perfect. In this crazy, hectic week—feeling overwhelmed with things to get done I had to pull over to the side of the road, to embrace the beauty, take time to pause, and appreciate the wonder of God's creation. A Note to Caregivers

This devotion comes from *Strength and Grace*, a daily devotion booklet for Caregivers.

Becoming a caregiver for my mother after her stroke was a transition fraught with anxiety. It reminded me of the same feelings as first becoming a new parent: Am I up to the task? How will I know what to do?

And just as I did for our baby, I went through the house trying to anticipate anything that could cause my mother harm—removing rugs, buying unbreakable drinking glasses, installing safety bars in the bathroom, and leaving a monitor running at night in case she needed me. I did everything I could think of to keep her safe.

But even with all the precautions, I found myself not sleeping soundly, ever on the alert for her call. As I prayed to fall asleep and stay asleep, God brought to mind a saying I'd heard from the pulpit, "Anxiety is caused by worrying about the what if; focus on the what is. God IS sovereign, God IS love, God IS gracious and righteous, and our God IS full of compassion."

What a difference that made in my anxiety level. I sighed a big sigh and drifted off to sleep. Lord, help me to put my trust in all that You are.

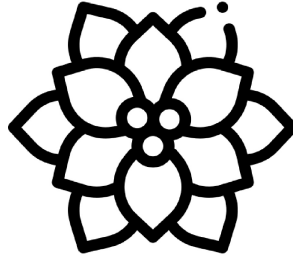
