


Camp Come & Play



"Transforming" Book Recommendation


Being transgender in the church, especially as a young person, can be scary. The people doing the most harm to the transgender community are overwhelmingly people of faith. —Rebekah Bruesehoff, teenager, advocate, and ELCA Lutheran, in the foreword to the new edition of Transforming.

Austen Hartke's newly updated book Transforming is a smart and engaging text that can serve as a cornerstone for people and congregations seeking to welcome and affirm transgender and nonbinary people in their ministry. Hartke begins his book with basic terminology and expands to scriptural support for transgender persons not just being in the church, hidden in the back row, but serving in openness and authenticity. Caregiver Ministry

Out of love, out of obligation, maybe out of a sense of just doing what's right, you might be one of more than 40 million adults in North America taking care of an elderly, chronically ill or disabled loved one.

Are you on the road to caregiver burnout? Burnout is not taken lightly by psychologists—who define it as "a debilitating psychological condition brought about by unrelieved stress"—and should not be taken lightly by you. By the time most caregivers suspect burnout, they're already suffering myriad symptoms.

In addition to coping with a loved one's illness, they might also deal with financial pressures, changes in family dynamics and a general disruption in family life. It's time to ask for help if you have any of the following:

Fourteen Warning Signs of Caregiver Burnout

- Lack of energy
- Overwhelming fatigue
- Sleep problems (too much or too little)
- Changes in eating habits; weight loss or gain
- A feeling of hopelessness
- Withdrawing from, or losing interest in, activities you once enjoyed
- Neglecting your own physical and emotional needs
- Feeling like caregiving is controlling your life
- Becoming unusually impatient, irritable or argumentative with the person you're caring for and/or with others
- Anxiety about the future
- Depression or mood swings
- Difficulty coping with everyday things
- Headaches, stomachaches, and other physical problems
- Lowered resistance to illness

Here is a prayer for you, the caregiver: Lord Jesus, today we pray for the caregivers in our Trinity family who sometimes feel isolated and forgotten, overwhelmed and anxious. Bless them, encourage them, strengthen them, and give them peace in the midst of their burdens and pressure. Keep them close to Your heart and enable us to give care to them when they need it most and expect it the least. In Jesus name we pray, Amen.

Mothers' Day: It's Your Time

On Mothers' Day, most moms just want to spend the day with their loved ones. So this year, give your mother the gift of health and well-being. Mother's Day marks the kick-off of National Women's Health Week (May 11–17): a week designed for women across the nation to make their health a top priority and take simple steps to live safer and healthier lives. The theme for this year is "It's Your Time;" encouraging women to take time for their health and receive regular checkups, eat healthier, get enough sleep, manage their stress, and stay active with fitness and exercise. As many busy Moms know, it's easy to get caught up in the daily tasks of work and family life. Between work, making lunches, paying bills, shuttling the kids to where they need to be, spending time with your spouse, and everything in between, you might laugh at the thought of "me" time. Often, we as mothers, try to do the impossible. We try to be everything to everybody, putting the needs of our family above our own. As a result, our health and fitness suffers, leaving us to be no good to anyone. If you're guilty of neglecting one of the most important people in your family, yourself, pull out that to-do list and add yourself back at the top. Not only will you reap the benefits, but so will everyone around you.

Night of Miracles (FIC BER) is the sequel to The Story of Arthur Truluv (also available in the Trinity Library), although it can be read as a stand-alone book. The setting is the fictional town of Mason, Missouri and focuses on characters who live there. Lucille teaches baking classes; Monica is a waitress at Polly's Henhouse and Tiny, a cab driver, has a crush on Monica. Iris is a new resident who left Boston to find a new life and to get over a divorce, and Lucille's neighbor, Abby, is dealing with a cancer diagnosis. This novel provides comfort, offers hope, and reminds us of the goodness inherent in people who come together to help each other.
